



Parathyroid Scan

Parathyroid scans are used to look at the function and position of the parathyroid glands. These are very tiny glands that are positioned in the neck.

A special liquid called a radioactive tracer will be injected into a vein in your arm. This enables us to obtain images of your parathyroid glands. A series of images over the next 2 hours will be taken. A 10 minute image will be taken 10 minutes after your injection. You will then be given a time to return for a further scan which takes approximately 45 minutes.

Important Instructions

- Please drink at least a pint of fluid one hour before your appointment if possible.
- Please take all your prescribed medication as normal.
- Please wear loose and comfortable clothing, preferably with no metal buttons or buckles.
- You can eat and drink normally.

You can expect to be in the department for about 2 hours.

Other points

- It is unlikely that you will have any side effects from this injection.
- We will ask you to drink plenty of fluids for 24hours after your injection.
- As you will be receiving a slightly radioactive injection, we advise that you avoid close prolonged contact with pregnant women or children for 48 hours following your injection.
