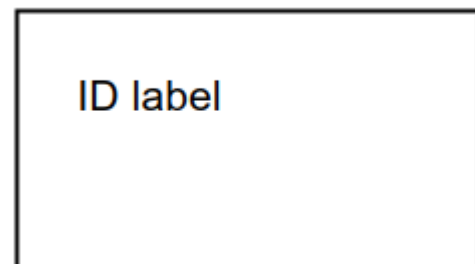

What is a barium swallow?

This is an examination of the upper part of your gastric tract, from the mouth to the stomach. It will investigate the way you swallow food and liquid. You will need to either stand on a small step or sit on a chair in front of an x-ray machine, and drink some thick, fruit flavoured fluid (barium). The progress of this fluid from your mouth to your stomach will be observed on a TV monitor and recorded by film and/or video.

The examination only takes a few minutes, and causes no discomfort. If you have any concerns then you can ask your nurse to contact us and we can answer any questions you may have.
