Treated Spinal Cord Compression - What you Need to Know

Radiotherapy information for Torbay Hospital Patients

You have had a confirmed spinal cord compression which has been treated.

On leaving hospital, you and your carers need to be aware of the potential for changing or worsening symptoms.

These may include

- Pain
- Changes in mobility
- Changes in sensation (numbness, pins and needles, or "fuzziness") in hands and arms/ or legs and feet.
- Changes in your bowel/bladder function
