# Essential Preoperative COVID Test Information for Patients Having Surgical Procedures Requiring General Anaesthesia, Regional Anaesthesia and Sedation

As you are having a day surgery operation we want to keep you safe. If you have an operation whilst you have a COVID infection, your outcomes may affected. This is particularly important if you are unvaccinated. We therefore need you to undertake a **free lateral flow device test**, at **home**, **48-72 hours before your surgery** for your own safety and that of our staff. We then recommend that you minimise your exposure to others between the test and your procedure.

You need to order these **free** tests yourself via the **gov.uk** website **as soon as** you are told that you require an operation. You can also use the link below:

### If you do not have access to the internet, tests can be ordered by phone by calling 119

Unfortunately, the government does not allow hospitals to give these out so you need to order these yourself. You will need to work through the series of steps described below. Please enlist the assistance of a friend or relative if you are having difficulties.

### How to order a lateral flow test device from gov.uk

Type into your search engine	'gov uk order lateral flow test' or similar phrase
Enter the gov.uk website	You are eligible to order a lateral flow test as you are coming into hospital for surgery or a procedure
Sign into your account or create one if you do not have one. You can reset your password if you have forgotten it.

When you take your test, you will then need to upload the result of your lateral flow test to the government website which will generate an e-mail confirmation.

We need you to bring this confirmation of your negative test result when you attend on the day of surgery. Please see below how to do this:

## How to report a test on the gov.uk website

In summary, to have your procedure at Torbay Hospital you need to:

- 1. Order a lateral flow test (via the internet or by phone by calling 119)
- 2. Take a lateral flow test
- 3. Report the test (via the internet or by phone by calling 119)
- 4. Bring in confirmation on the day of surgery
