


Progress Since Last Update:

The external wall construction is now complete and the roof joists, roof insulation and roof covering have also been finished. Boarding has been finished with the insulation board and waterproof membrane in place.

The car park groundworks have re-commenced and our next main area of focus is on getting the building watertight by installing the windows so that we can start fitting it out internally.

At a meeting of Dartmouth Town Council on Monday 28 February, councillors selected a preferred bidder to act as a development partner in a community bid for the former hospital site in the town.

We and the council are both keen for the community bid to succeed, and are now working together through all the detailed legal and financial considerations.

As we have previously shared with you, we need to sell the site to fund our contribution to the new Health and Wellbeing Centre.
