Torbay Hospital's mortuary transformation



In the last year Torbay Hospital's mortuary has undergone a complete refurbishment. Originally completed in the 1970s, the mortuary now receives over 1,900 patients a year. The Human Tissue Authority (HTA) published its report in August 2017 and worked with the Trust's mortuary team to bring the mortuary up to date and meet new standards. Simon Hughes, Mortuary Manager (pictured) led the changes. Medical Director Rob Dyer said: "Simon and the mortuary team have worked incredibly hard to make the improvements as quickly as possible, working in partnership with the HTA, so that we not only meet but exceed expected standards. It is so important for families and loved ones to know that we are caring sensitively for those who have died while being under our care.

We are more confident than ever that we can provide care and preserve dignity for these patients and for their grieving relatives."

Researchers in Residence win prize

In July Dr Felix Gradinger and Dr Julian Elston, our 'researchers-in-residence' attended the inaugural Implementation Science Research Conference at Kings College, London, the theme of which was: 'Strengthening partnerships between researchers, health professional and policy-makers.' We are delighted that Felix and Julian were awarded a runner up prize for best oral presentation. Felix and Julian are from [Plymouth University](#) but are based permanently within our Trust's NHS teams. They work with staff, our partners, other key stakeholders and the general public across South Devon and Torbay to assess how the system is responding to our care model and its potential impact on people's experience of person-centred, co-ordinated care. Felix, pictured (right) receiving the prize from Prof. Nick Sevdalis said: "The way we live and innovate every day in relation to the conference theme must have resonated with our peers! Julian and I are really chuffed to have received this prize, acknowledging our work - co-producing with the ICO ('integrated care organisation') and other local stakeholders' insights around our integrated care model - as 'outstanding'."

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Trust simulation team showcase virtual reality in healthcare to staff

On Friday 10 August Trust staff were encouraged to visit Torbay Hospital's Horizon Centre to learn how we are using virtual reality (VR) as a medical training tool, and experience using it for themselves. Nick Peres, Head of Learning Technologies R&D and his team are working with the Human Interface Technologies (HIT) team at Birmingham University, who demonstrated some of the virtual simulation work they have been creating which we can apply in a healthcare setting. Pictured is Prof. Bob Stone, head of HIT with Judy Falcoe, Trust Director of Workforce and Organisational Development, wearing a Vive Focus virtual reality headset – just one of many pieces of innovative VR technology that was on display. The Vive Focus is cable free and shows 360 degree content that the user can move around and navigate using both their head and a controller. On display in this particular headset was a project that has been created to help distract the user from pain by immersing them in an interactive, cinematic garden space. “We are really excited to be working with Bob and his team at Birmingham,” says Nick Peres. “We will continue to strengthen our collaborative relations with both academia and industry so that we can remain at the forefront of VR simulation work, and harness the value this technology can offer us.” Watch a short video of the day [here](#).
