Partnership announced to build Dartmouth Health and Wellbeing Centre

South Hams District Council and the Trust have announced that they have identified a proposed new site for the Health and Wellbeing Centre on part of the overflow Park and Ride car park in Dartmouth. The plans are for the Council to provide the land and to construct a purpose-built Health and Wellbeing Centre to the NHS Trust's specification. It is intended that the new building will include the GP practice, a pharmacy, services that are currently being provided from the Dartmouth Clinic site and a base for voluntary sector organisations.

The Friends Centre, Brixham now underway

The new-build Health and Wellbeing Centre at the Brixham Hospital site is now well underway. We are working in partnership with the Brixham Hospital League of Friends (LoF) and voluntary sector organisation, Brixham Does Care, to build the centre. It will be known as 'The Friends Centre,' in recognition of the generous contribution, time and commitment that the Brixham Hospital LoF has made to create this new space for the people of Brixham. Peter Day, Chair of the Brixham LoF said: "I am pleased to report that the build for 'The Friends Centre' is progressing well, with the main walls now under construction. The size and shape of the centre has been designed to provide an attractive landmark, whilst at the same time blending into the existing Hospital site. We are really proud to name the new building 'The Friends Centre.' We feel it identifies the true nature of its usage and

acknowledges our funding contribution of £800,000."

Dr Andrew Thornton, local GP and Clinical Director for Paignton and Brixham locality said: "The Friends Centre will play an important role at the Brixham Health and Wellbeing site, and we are continuing to work in partnership with the voluntary sector, community Hospital and primary care to look at how



we can ensure that the people of Brixham can access the widest possible range of services locally to fulfil their health and wellbeing needs." Emma Barton, Director at Brixham Does Care said: "The Friends Centre will provide the community with access to a variety of health and care services and the day care service will aim to provide social and mental interaction and also support care givers to have a much-needed break through the day care service." Brixham Does Care will run The Friends Centre when it opens in early 2019.

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Teignmouth public engagement

The six week South Devon and Torbay CCG-led engagement with local people on options for possible changes to health and care services in Teignmouth ended on 8 June 2018. These options include the possible co-location of the Health and Wellbeing team with GP practices in a new purpose built 21st century NHS facility.

During the engagement period hundreds of questionnaires were completed and a number of letters and emails received. This feedback along with comments made at the drop-in events is being reviewed and will be summarised in an engagement report which will be published and sent to those who have offered views on the ideas. The feedback provided by local people is being considered by Trust and CCG staff reviewing what changes are needed to ensure the sustainability of primary care and to strengthen the work of community based teams in meeting the needs of local people.

Trust seeks the public's views on urgent and emergency care

On 28 March we learned that the Department of Health and Social Care is to provide up to £13m of funding to improve Torbay Hospital's Emergency Department, and our overall emergency and urgent care provision. We are now starting to develop detailed plans with our partners, and would like to hear the views of local people as to what is important to them when seeking urgent and emergency care. With training the volunteer can give standardised, brief advice depending on the outcome of the screening, and facilitate a referral on to other services if required.
